

Post office guides help you develop your collection

Many people think that stamp collecting is just that. The collecting of new stamp issues, older stamps, plate blocks, booklets, souvenir sheets and so on. Others believe that stamps can be collected on beautiful commercial or historical covers. Still others go beyond that and study their covers and the stamps upon them. Yet, there are even more ways to get deeply involved in philately.

There are those who collect postal history exclusively. Some of these individuals limit themselves to prestamp letters and envelopes, while others concentrate on modern mail usages. These postal historians have one thing in common: they love to study the routes, rates and usages of their covers. County and town

collectors concentrate on the postal history of a small geographic area of a country, state or province.

A basic tool these collectors need to carry out their studies is a list of post offices. Such listings can also serve as tools for thematic or topical collectors as well. Are the towns of Elbow and Eyebrow, Saskatchewan, acceptable in a thematic collection? The answer is yes, as the book *People Places*, described below, will reveal. This article will give you an annotated listing of publications that provide this type of information for Canada.

The books and pamphlets listed below are a varied lot. They were written or produced by collectors, dealers and public institutions, most within the last 25 years. Each was produced for a different reason, and as such, they are not necessarily consistent from one to

another, nor are they all as user-friendly as one would wish. Some may be a challenge to locate, while others should be available from dealers in philatelic literature.

Canada Post Offices, 1755-1895 by Frank W. Campbell. This was the first publication that purported to list all of Canada's post offices, from the first to open in Nova Scotia until the close of the 19th century. This work was completed in 1958 and made available as mimeographed copies for those interested in purchasing it. In 1972, a Quartermain reprint was published. Campbell, like many other postal historians, really did not have an interest in modern postal history, hence the finishing date of 1895. He also did not include Newfoundland in the listing.

Over the years with more research being

done, the Campbell listing has not weathered the passing of time. Much new information has been found, such as 1754 (not 1755) being the opening date of the first post office in Canada — in Halifax. The book has many hand-drawn illustrations of postmarks, which are useful. This is still the only all-Canada printed listing available.

I will describe the remaining books and pamphlets by province and territory, traveling from west to east, and starting with the far north.

The Postal History of Yukon Territory Canada by Robert G. Woodall. This book, privately published in 1964 and reprinted by Quartermain in 1976, is far more than a listing

of post offices covering the history of the post of the Yukon Territory from 1843 to 1961. The chapter devoted to post offices and postmarks is extensive, giving much information on the post offices, their locations, their names and the postmarks they use. Again, this

publication is the only one available for this territory and as such is the definitive work. With the many changes and growth in the Yukon, an updated version is needed.

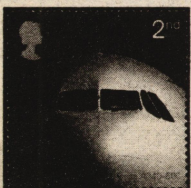

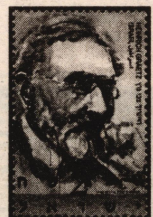

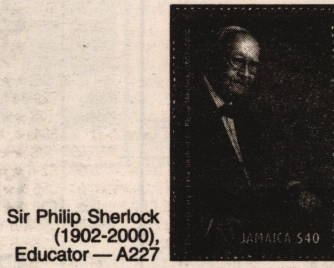

Coutts. This is a handy reference on the location and brief history of each Yukon town and sources for the names of the towns in this territory. It was published in 1980.

Northwest Territories, Postal Cancellations, 1907-1986 by Kevin O'Reilly. Despite its title, the book does not concentrate on the postal markings of the territories. It has a wealth of information on the post offices and is one of the best comprehensive books published on the subject. Not only does it give the opening and closing dates of post offices, but it also gives their location, a detailed history for each and the origin of each name. This book also includes the post offices formerly in

the Northwest Territories and now part of the newly created (1999) Nunavut Territory. It, like the Yukon book, would benefit from an updating but still remains an extremely useful tool.

Territorial Post Offices of Canada by William G. Robinson and William E. Topping. Details of the post offices from the Western part of Canada have been compiled by Robinson and Topping, and a number of the books following in this listing are edited by them and follow basically the same pattern. The post office listing is a computer listing. It includes information such as the name, changes of status, dates established and closed, location and, in later editions, the money order office number (MOON) and the post

office computer number (POCON).

In addition, there is a generic list of the types of cancellations used in each post office, though not illustrated. In this book one finds the post office listings for the following Canadian territories before they became provinces or joined Confederation: Alberta, Assiniboia, Athabasca, Colonial British Columbia, Keewatin, Northwest Territories, Saskatchewan and the Yukon.

British Columbia Post Offices, edited by

William E. Topping and William G. Robinson. This is the second edition (published in 1991) of a work originally published in 1983. It, and the second edition of the *Post Offices of Alberta* (described below), are now in an 8½-

inch by 11-inch format, while all the other Robinson/Topping booklets measure 6 inches by 9 inches.

Post Offices of Alberta, edited by William G. Robinson and William E. Topping. First published in 1985 with an extensively revised second edition published in 1998.

Saskatchewan Post Offices, edited

by William G. Robinson and William E. Topping. The first edition was published in 1987 and a reprint was produced in 2000.

People Places: The Dictionary of Saskatchewan Place Names by Bill Barry. This was not produced for stamp collectors but it is a treasure trove of information for the

philatelist and particularly for the thematicist. It provides data on the location of the town, its population and which railroad served the community. More importantly, it gives information on where the town name came from, sometimes with a lengthy historical description.

This is also the book in which you find that Eyebrow can fit in an optical thematic and that Elbow can fit in a collection on rivers.

Manitoba Post Offices, edited by William G. Robinson and William E. Topping. To my knowledge only one edition has been published, in 1988.

Ontario Post Offices by Robert C. Smith. This seminal two-volume work was published in 1988. The first volume is an alphabetic listing of all the post offices of Ontario.

Vol. II lists the post offices by county and district. Of all the post office listings available for Canada, this is the only one to do this. Again, this is a computer listing, giving the name, opening

and closing dates, county and township name, and alternate names for the same post office. A small errata listing is found at the end of the book.

This is still the bible of Ontario post offices notwithstanding its 15 years of life. The author has kept the information up-to-date in his computer and makes available a copy of the additional information he has found. This list now has more than 125 new entries or corrections.

Les Bureaux de Poste du Québec by Anatole Walker. Published in 1987, this compendium of Quebec post offices is similar in data to Smith's Ontario book described previously as it lists post office names and the county they belong to, with opening and closing dates and alternate names for the post offices. The author, an Oblate father, had the initials L.A., standing for Lawrence Anatole.

Father Walker confused his readers by using the name Lawrence Walker when writing in English and Anatole Walker when writing in French. Many a seasoned collector did not realize Lawrence and Anatole were the same person.

Walker also produced some 15 county or

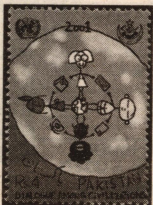

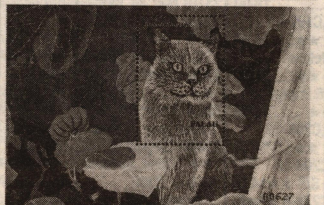

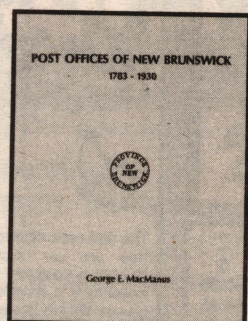

geographical area books in which he provided the same post office information as in his *Les Bureaux de Poste du Québec*. In addition, in the county and area books, he listed the postmasters, their terms of office and the reason for their termination.

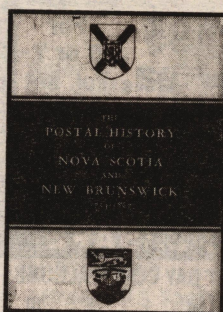
Listing of post offices in Atlantic Canada can be found in general handbooks on the stamps and postal history of these four provinces in addition to published listings, as they issued their own stamps until each of them joined Confederation. The handbook authors felt it important to include this type of information.

Post Offices of New Brunswick, 1783-1930 by George E. MacManus. This erudite listing was compiled by MacManus as a New Brunswick bicentennial project and was published in 1984. It is in computer format and chock-full of information. You can find the past, present and future names of the post offices, opening and closing dates, the county it belonged to, the revenue it generated at various



dates, who the postmasters were, when they were appointed, the post-marking hammers used by the office and when they were proofed. There is also a remarks section where MacManus adds very pertinent information about some of the post offices. There is an extensive section on the hammers and cancellations and most of these are illustrated. Unfortunately, the information has not been updated since 1984 and it does not cover post office activity after 1930.

The Postal History of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, 1754-1867 by C.M. Jephcott, V.G. Greene, and John H.M. Young. This is the definitive work on the postal history of these two provinces. A section at the

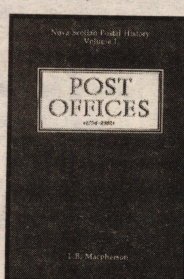


back of the book lists way offices and post offices for each province alphabetically. In addition, it indicates the name of the county to which the post office belonged and its years of operation.

The Nova Scotia Post, Its Offices, Masters and Marks, 1700-1867 by J.J. MacDonald. Despite its title, three-quarters of this book relates the history of the post in Nova Scotia and its hammers and cancels. The remainder is taken up with the list of post offices opened

and closed during the period covered by the book. The information is quite interesting. It gives locations, population and hammers used. It also covers, in a narrative fashion, the history of the post in that community and its postmasters.

Post Offices (1754-1981) by L. B. Macpherson, Vol. 1 of the series "Nova Scotian Postal History." This book, published in 1982, is in three parts. The first is a 10-page



introduction giving general information on post offices of Nova Scotia, the second covers the list of post offices with their opening and closing dates, and the third is a series of extensive endnotes cross-referenced to the post offices they refer to. The book is completed

by an addendum of new information found after the manuscript was completed. This lists 126 way offices and the dates they were converted to post offices.

The Post Office on Prince Edward Island (1787-1990) by G. Douglas Murray. Published in 1990, the book begins with an

introduction to the history of the post on Prince Edward Island and is followed by the listings. Murray's is the only book to list the post offices three ways: alphabetical, chronological and geographical (by lot and concession number). The book closes with two annexes. One houses a

long list of endnotes to the listing, and the second provides the MOON, POCON and nonaccounting numbers for each post office.

The Postage Stamps and Postal History of Newfoundland by Winthrop S. Boggs. The

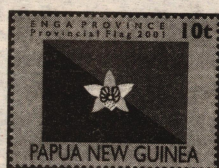

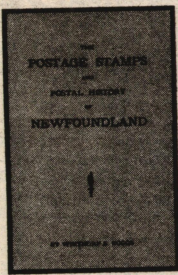

author published this book in 1942 and provides a chapter at the end listing the 1940 list of post offices in Newfoundland, along with the previous post office names before they were renamed by the Nomenclature Board from 1904 to 1940.

Newfoundland Specialized Stamp Catalogue with Pictorial Postcards and Advertising Business Corner Cards (Fifth Edition, 2002) by John M. Walsh and John G. Butt. This is definitely one of the most extensive specialized catalogs of any of the British North America postal authorities. Three chapters are devoted to the post offices. The first covers the Newfoundland town post offices and cancel types, the second those of the St. John's post office and sub post offices, and the last those of Labrador. Newfoundland and Labrador have some of the most fascinat-



ing town names in Canada, so it also contains excellent material for thematic collectors. Unfortunately, this catalog does not give origins of the town names. Some examples of these unusual and sometimes suggestive names are Aquaforte, Broom's Bottom, Cuckolds Cover, Dark Tickle, and so on.

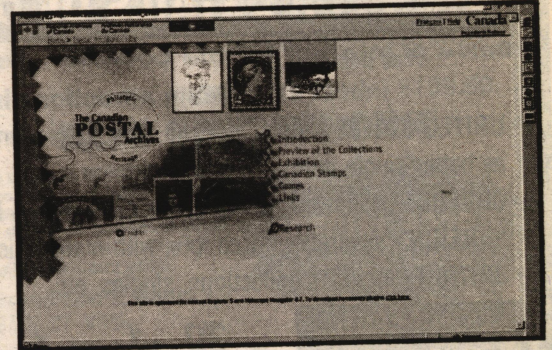
Frank Campbell's book *Canada Post Offices, 1755-1895*, mentioned at the beginning of this article, was put together by perusing the post office index cards in Canada and London, England. The Ottawa index cards are now available to researchers via the Internet. They can be found on the site of the National Archives of Canada. The available data includes information on all postmasters for all

Canadian post offices, either closed or opened. Access begins at www.archives.ca. Under the heading "EXPLORE" click on "Postal Archives," then "Research," and finally "Post Offices and Postmasters."

Like any other site you can find typos. If the post office you are seeking is not found in the list, then try an alternate spelling. I collect the postal history of what I call Papineau County. At any given time the villages in Papineau County can be found in Ottawa, Gatineau or Argenteuil counties as well.

One of the villages, the one where my mother was born, is called Fasset. For a while I couldn't find it in the database. One day I spelled it as "Fasset" with one "t," and up it popped on the screen. This one was easy but sometimes you have to be creative.

On other occasions the search results will surprise you. You may get more than one post office submitted to you simply because there

is more than one with the same name. From time to time a post office with a completely different name will pop up. The most common reason for this is that a postmaster in that post office had the same surname as the name of the post office you are searching for. Isn't the Internet fun?
